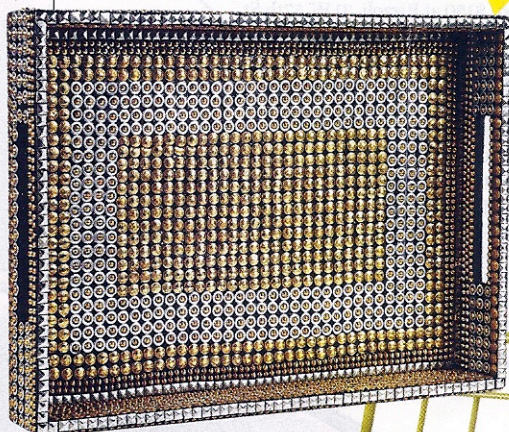


BEST BETS

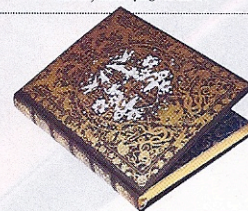

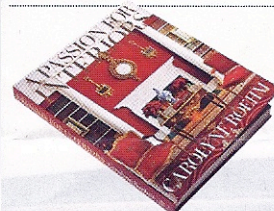
